Following on from our successful half conference in 2008 and the production of the Trans 10 Top Tips Postcard by popular demand we bring you Time for T Conference 2.

We will explore issues faced by the young and older Transgender population. With specific insight through three case stories of their experiences.

What can you expect to get out of this event

- ▶ Identification of key health issues affecting the Transgender population through a facilitative approach to the day.
- ▶ Delegates to be informed and start to engage with the Transgender population who experience health inequalities arising from discrimination and the achievements and learning from Pacesetters so far and how this is changing the way that the NHS deals with equality and diversity. This will have a particular focus on initiatives which bring together equality communities and health services.
- ▶ For the Pacesetters programme and wider NHS to be better informed about the improvements that can be made by hearing from the Transgender population.

Last time you attended you promised to change/do at least one thing in your organisation that would improve an issue that affected the Transgender population. You will be given the opportunity via a bulletin board to feedback your successes, achievements and challenges. These will be shared with colleagues throughout the day.

Workshop 3: What are we suppose to do?
